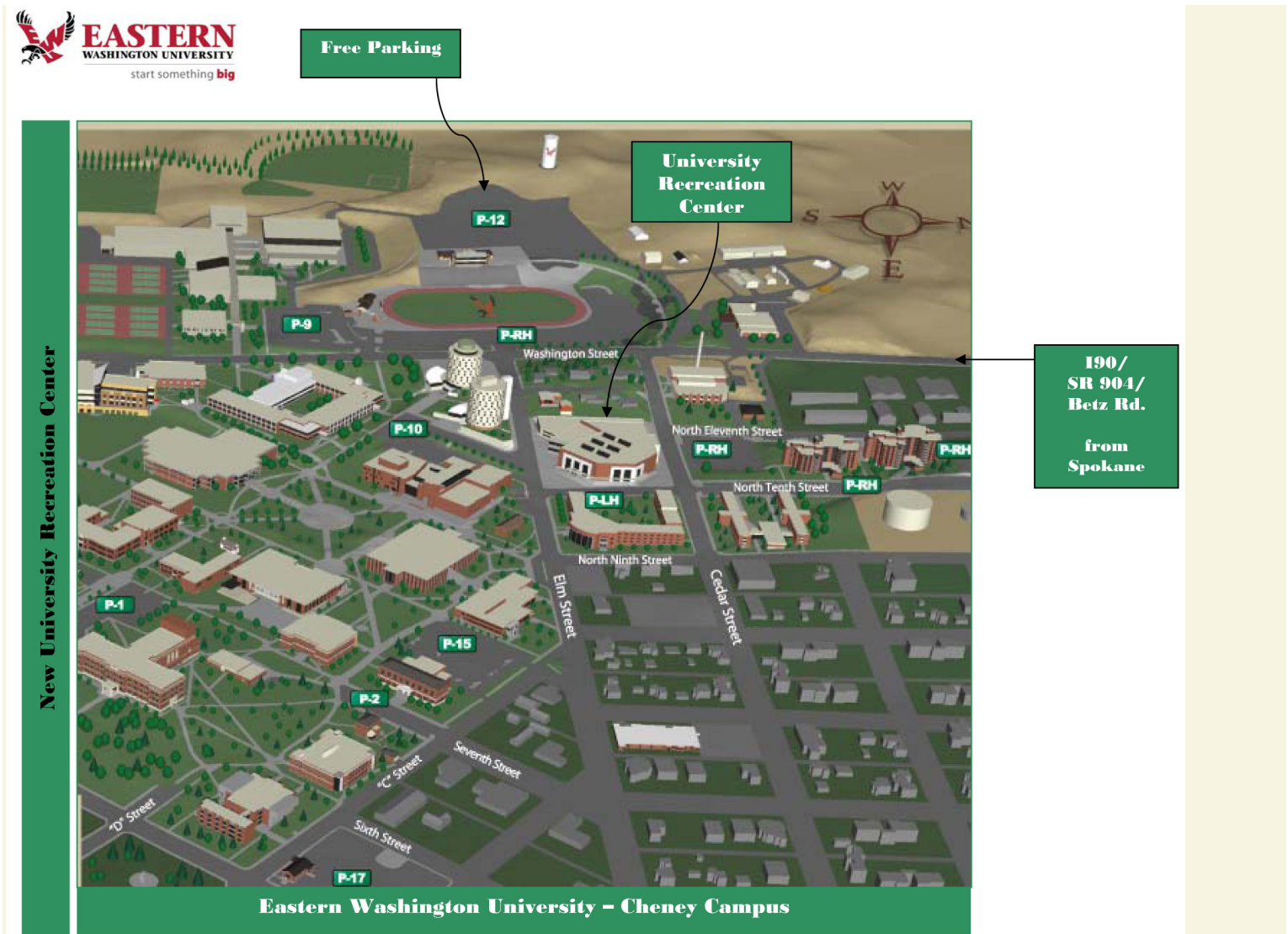
Parking

Driving directions to EWU URC

- From Spokane, take **I-90 West bound toward Seattle**
- At **exit 270**, take ramp **right** for **SR-904 West** toward Cheney / Four Lakes 0.7 mi
- Bear **right** onto **SR-904 / LT Col Michael Anderson Memorial Hwy / S SR 904 Hwy** 4.1 mi
- Bear **right** toward **Betz Rd** 0.2 mi
- Keep **straight** onto **Betz Rd** 0.9 mi
- Road **name changes** to **Washington St** 1.0 mi
- Turn **left** onto **Elm St** 0.1 mi

GENERAL INFORMATION

Any questions not covered by these rules will be governed by the applicable rules in the 2010-2011 U.S. Figure Skating Rulebook. Please check the US Figure Skating website for Technical Notification updates. This competition is sanctioned by both **US Figure Skating** and **Skate Canada**.

Ice Surface

The ice surface measures 85' x 200' with slightly rounded corners.

Entries

Complete and mail with entry fee to **Registrar, Jennifer Hentges, 14411 E Forker Ridge Lane, Spokane, WA 99216**. **Enclose a self-addressed, stamped, legal-sized envelope** to receive a copy of the competition schedule. **Entries must be filled out completely and must be postmarked on or before January 20, 2011**. Please use official entry forms; reproductions are acceptable. ISI members wishing to participate in Basic Skills, please contact the Registrar.

Eligibility

Eligibility will be determined by tests passed and age as of January 20, 2011. All skaters should be prepared to show proof of age. Any skater may enter one event higher than the event for which he/she qualifies by test. Refer to rules 3640 – 4091 and TR 45.00 of the current rulebooks. Events with large numbers of entries may be split into multiple groups. These groups will be split by age for Non-Test through Pre-Juvenile and by draw for Juvenile through Senior and Adult. No final rounds will be skated. Pairs skating will be a couple composed of a lady and a man. In either singles or pairs, the short and long program will be scored as separate events. No combined scores will be given. Skaters will receive one mark for technical elements in Compulsory Moves, Jumps and Spins events.

Scoring

The ISU Judging System (IJS) to be used for Juvenile through Senior. All other events for this competition will be judged using the 6.0 judging system. Critiques using the IJS scoring will be available upon prior request and contingent upon the judges' schedules. All Skaters in the Juvenile through Senior short program and free skate Singles events are required to submit the *PLANNED PROGRAM CONTENT FORM* with their entry form. **A \$25 processing fee will be charged for any entry for Juvenile through Senior short program and free skating singles event missing this form.**

Fees

The entry fee is \$60 per person for a single event, \$90 for two events, and \$20 for each additional event thereafter. The entry fee for Pairs is \$90 per team for single event, \$135 for two events. Basic Skills events are \$30 per person for a single event, \$50 for two events, and \$10 for each event thereafter. Checks should be made payable to "**Spokane FSC**". Canadian funds will be accepted at par. Late entries will be accepted at the discretion of the referee and the local organizing committee and will be subject to a late entry fee of \$25. **A fee of \$25 will be charged for checks returned for non-sufficient funds (NSF) and must be paid prior to the start of competition in order to compete.** Refunds will be issued in accordance with Rule 3230 - 3235 of the US Figure Skating Rulebook and only if the event is not held or if the competitor can demonstrate that failure to participate is because of a medical condition that a physician certifies will prevent the competitor from competing safely, or because of a death in the competitor's immediate family. In any event with only one entry, the skater will be given the option of withdrawing from the event (with a refund) or skating an exhibition or critique if time permits (without a refund). All refunds, if applicable, will be mailed within 30 days after the completion of the competition.

Registration

The official registration desk will be located in the URC at the lower level customer service desk rink side. The registration desk will open 60 minutes before the first event/practice session. All competitors are required to register as soon as possible after arrival at rink. Competition CDs (**no CD-RWs or Cassettes**) should be turned in at least 90 minutes prior to event.

Coaches Registration/Credentials

To receive a coach credential, the **designated coach MUST:**

- 1) Have completed the coaches registration process**
- 2) Be a member of U.S. Figure Skating**
- 3) Be Category B CER Compliant**

The credentials are marked with the individual's name & non-transferable. You must have credentials to enter the competition areas, the warm-up area & the locker rooms. The competitor's coach will pick up their credential separately at check-in. **A photo ID must be shown when the credential is picked up.** *CREDENTIALS ARE NOT TRANSFERABLE!* For additional information go to <http://www.usfigureskating.org/content.asp?menu=coaches&id=451> *Foreign Coaches coaching US Figure Skating member athletes at U.S. Figure Skating sanctioned events will be required to fulfill the same requirements as US coaches coaching US athletes; foreign coaches coaching foreign athletes only at U.S. Figure Skating sanctioned events will not.* ISI

coaches are invited & welcomed to participate in continuing education, & ISI coaches that coach US Figure Skating member athletes U.S. Figure Skating sanctioned events are required to meet the continuing education requirements in order to do so.

Practice Ice

Reservations for ALL practice ice must be made and paid for in advance. Practice sessions will be held each day of the competition. Practice ice will be \$12 per 30-minute session. **Requests for practice ice** should be mailed as **a part of your registration form**. The schedule will be determined by the entries. Competition CD's will be played during the scheduled practice ice, once per competitor *as time permits*, on a first-come, first-served basis.

Awards

Awards will be presented to 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 4th places in each group. All Basic Skills participants will receive an award. Awards will be presented immediately following each event of the competition. Artistic Awards will be presented to three skaters entered in Free Skate events who display the best overall presentation and interpretation of their program. One award will be presented to a Pre-Preliminary, Preliminary, Pre-Juvenile, Open Juvenile or Juvenile (Low-Test) skater, one award will be presented to an Intermediate, Novice, Junior or Senior (High-Test) level skater, and one award to an Adult skater. Level grouping is subject to change based on entries. There will be one judge for each level who will determine the trophy winners.

Music

CDs are the only acceptable media. CDs must be clearly marked with name, event entered and the music length. Each CD must have only ONE (1) track on it. Separate discs must be used for each event. Any disc with more than one (1) track will NOT be accepted! Due to compatibility and reliability reasons, music may NOT be submitted on re-recordable "CD-RW" discs. CDs must be turned in at the registration desk at the time of registration, and will not be returned until the event has been skated. These should be competition CD's, not practice media. The Music Committee will accept no responsibility for breakage or damage, but will take every precaution in their handling. **An extra CD at rink side is highly recommended.**

Video Tapes/Photographs

Podium pictures will be provided by Northwest Images. Video taping services will be provided by Peak Video.

Bulletins and Notices

An Official Announcement Bulletin Board will be available at the Registration Desk. The schedule is "tentative" and subject to change. All scheduling and any changes will be posted on the official bulletin board. Such posting supersedes all other scheduling. Results will be posted on the glass, rink side. The starting time of each event will be posted and this will be considered sufficient notification to the competitors. Competitors must report to the monitor and be ready to skate **45 minutes prior to the posted starting time for their events.** Sanctions from US Figure Skating and Skate Canada will be posted on the official bulletin board.

Tickets

No admission will be charged. All events are open to spectators.

EVENT QUALIFICATIONS & SPECIFICATIONS

Free Skate Events

Non-test (Beginner) – Open to skaters who have not passed any free skating test

Freeskate: See Rule 3721 for well-balanced program requirements. Time: 1:30 +/- 10 sec.

Pre-Preliminary – Open to skaters who have not passed the Preliminary FS Test.

Freeskate: See Rule 3711 for well-balanced program requirements. Time: 1:30 +/- 10 sec.

Preliminary — Open to skaters who have passed the Pre-preliminary FS Test, but no higher than the Preliminary FS Test.

Freeskate: See Rule 3701 for well-balanced program requirements. Time: 1:30 +/- 10 sec.

Pre-Juvenile — Open to skaters who have passed the Preliminary FS Test, but no higher than the Pre-Juvenile FS Test.

Freeskate: See Rule 3691 for well-balanced program requirements. Time: 2:00 +/- 10 sec.

Juvenile — Open to skaters who have passed the Pre-juvenile FS Test, but no higher than the Juvenile FS Test.

Freeskate: See Rule 3681 for well-balanced program requirements. Time: 2:15 +/- 10 sec.

Open Juvenile – Same as Juvenile except Open to skaters who are 13 years or older.

Intermediate — Open to skaters who have passed the Juvenile FS test, but no higher than the Intermediate FS Test who are 18 years or younger.

Freeskate: See Rule 3672 for well-balanced program requirements. Time: 2:30 +/- 10 sec.

Short Program : U.S. Figure Skating rulebook refer to Rule 3671. Program time: 2:00 max.

Novice — Open to skaters who have passed the Intermediate FS test, but no higher than the Novice FS Test.

Freeskate: See Rule 3663 for well-balanced program requirements. Time: Ladies 3:00 +/- 10 sec, Men 3:30 +/- 10 sec.

Short Program: U.S. Figure Skating rulebook refer to Rule 3661/3662. Program time: 2:30 max.

Junior — Open to skaters who have passed the Novice FS test, but no higher than the Junior FS test.

Freeskate: See Rule 3653 for well-balanced program requirements. Time: Ladies 3:30 +/- 10 sec, Men 4:00 +/- 10 sec.

Short Program: US Figure Skating rulebook, refer to Rule 3651/3652 (2010/2011 Elements). Program time: 2:50 max.

Senior — Open to skaters who have passed the Junior FS test, but no higher than Senior FS test.

Freeskate: See Rule 3643 for well-balanced program requirements. Time: Ladies 4:00 +/- 10 sec, Men 4:30 +/- 10 sec.

Short Program: US Figure Skating rulebook refer to Rule 3641/3642 (2010/2011 Elements). Program time: 2:50 max .

Adult Pre-Bronze — Open to skaters who have reached the age of 21 and have passed no U.S. Figure Skating test and/or no higher than the Adult Pre-Bronze skating test, the standard U.S. Figure Skating Pre-preliminary free skating test or the ISIA Freestyle 3 test. See Rule 3806.

Freeskate: Program time: 1:40 maximum.

Adult Bronze — Open to skaters who have reached the age of 21 and have passed no higher than the Adult Bronze Free Skating Test, the standard U.S. Figure Skating Preliminary Free Skating Test or the ISIA Freestyle 4 Test. See Rule 3801.

Freeskate: Program time: 1:50 maximum.

Adult Silver — Open to skaters who have reached the age of 21 and have passed no higher than the Adult Silver Free Skating Test, the standard U.S. Figure Skating Juvenile Free Skating Test or the ISIA Freestyle 5 Test. See Rule 3791.

Freeskate: Program time: 2:10 maximum.

Adult Gold — Open to skaters who have reached the age of 21 and have passed no higher than the Adult Gold Free Skating Test, the standard U.S. Figure Skating Juvenile Free Skating Test or the ISIA Freestyle 6 Test. See Rule 3781.

Freeskate: Program time: 2:40 maximum.

Compulsory Moves

Age and test requirements are the same as Free Skate. Compulsory moves will be skated without music. Required moves may be done in any order, without stops between elements. Each additional or repeated element will be penalized by .2. Connecting footwork is allowed but may not include half jumps. Combination jumps may not have a change of foot or turn between the jumps. Skaters will receive one mark overall from each judge for technical element. Events will be skated on a half-sheet of ice.

Jump Events

Age and test requirements are the same as Free Skate. No music will be played. Jumps may be skated twice and in any order. The best of the two jump attempts for each required jump and combination will be judged. If a skater is satisfied with the 1st jump attempt, then the 2nd attempt is not required. In situations where the skater is given the choice of the jumps to be performed, the first attempt will determine the jump to be judged; the skater will not be allowed to change jumps on the second attempt. Event will be skated on one half (1/2) of the ice surface for all skating levels. The judges will award one mark overall to each skater for technical element.

Spin Events

Age and test requirements are the same as Free Skate. No music will be played. Spins must be skated exactly as stated but may be skated in any order. Connecting steps may be used but will not affect the score. Event will be skated on one half (1/2) of the ice surface. The judges will award one mark overall to each skater for technical element. **We want to encourage better spinners in the Northwest, so have increased the minimum revolutions for each spin element by one revolution.**

Showcase

Men and ladies will compete against one another in the Showcase event. Only one mark will be given. This mark will be given for presentation. There will be no mark for technical element in the event. Only two (2) double jumps are permitted for Intermediate – Senior, but not encouraged. Only single jumps, including axels, will be allowed for Non-test – Juvenile and Adult. A .2 deduction will be taken for programs violating this restriction. Props which are placed on the ice will not be permitted. There will not be separate events for Light Entertainment and Dramatic Showcases.

Skaters will be awarded one mark for presentation. Judging will be on interpretation, style and composition. Professionals will not be allowed to help entrants in this event. Men and women may compete against each other. Qualifications to compete in a given level are the same as freestyle. Time duration will be appropriate to the level of the skater.

Team Event

This will be a fun event and give clubs a chance to skate together as a group. Teams will consist of four skaters each performing one of four elements. There will only be one category for the teams to enter so clubs must have skaters at least three different test levels on their team. A single event fee of \$60 will be charged and will cover all 4 skaters. Elements to be performed are:

BASIC SKILLS COMPETITION

ELIGIBILITY RULES FOR PARTICIPANTS

The competition is open to ALL skaters who are current eligible (ER 1.00) members of either the Basic Skills Program and/or are full members of U.S. Figure Skating. To be eligible, skaters must have submitted a membership application or be a member in good standing. Members of other organizations are eligible to compete but must be registered with the host Basic Skills Program/club or any other Basic Skills Program/club.

Eligibility will be based on skill level as of closing date of entries. All **Snowplow Sam and Basic Skills 1-8** skaters must skate at highest level passed or one level higher and NO official U.S. Figure Skating tests may have been passed including MIF or individual dances.

For the **Free skate 1-6, Test Track and Well Balanced levels**, eligibility will be based only upon highest free skate test level passed (moves in the field test level will not determine skater's competitive level). Skaters may skate at highest level passed OR one level higher BUT not both levels in the same event during the same competition.

It is very important to the success of the competition that skaters are placed in the correct divisions. If, for whatever reason, the Local Organizing Committee discovers that a skater has been placed in a category that is below their class level, the chairman and referee will have the option to move the skater into the proper division, even if this has to be done the day of the competition. This will ensure that every event is as fair as possible to the competitors. **Please verify your skating level with your skating director/instructor, and make sure their signature confirms your current skating level.**

For fees, awards and other information, see the general information section on pages 3 &4.

BASIC SKILLS EVENTS

BASIC SKILLS BEGINNER SPINS:

No music on half-ice. Spins should be skated exactly as stated and in this order. Skaters will perform one spin at a time (no excessive connecting steps). Skaters will be given one opportunity to perform each spin. Groups will be divided according to Basic/Free Skate test level. Spins should be a minimum of three revolutions each.

Basic Snowplow Sam-Basic 8 -Forward pivot- either foot, Two foot spin, Forward one foot spin

Free skate 1-6 - Two foot spin, Forward one foot spin, Sit Spin

BASIC SKILLS PAIRS EVENT:

The basic skills pair event shall consist of a variety of skating moves and connecting steps skated to music of the skater's choice. Pairs must demonstrate some degree of unison, especially in stroking and footwork. The required elements are: one lift from Group 1 or the waist loop lift from Group 2; one single throw jump is optional; one single solo jump; one jump combination or sequence of single jumps only; one pair spin, minimum of 3 revolutions, no change of foot or position; one solo spin, minimum of 3 revolutions, no change of foot or position; one death or pivot spiral, no minimum requirements is also optional; stroking forward and backward, clockwise and counterclockwise; footwork and connecting moves (including spread eagles and spirals) should be used throughout the program. Vocal music is permitted. Duration: 2:00 +/- 10 seconds.

BASIC SKILLS FREE DANCE EVENT:

The basic skills free dance event shall consist of the following elements, skated to music of the skater's choice: *Lifts*: One to two different types of short lifts (not to exceed six seconds), from the following: stationary lift, straight line lift, curve lift or rotational lift. Long lifts (including reverse rotational lift, serpentine lift or combination lift are not allowed). *Spins*: One dance spin or spin combination is permitted. A minimum of 2 revolutions on each foot by each partner is required. *Step Sequence*: One footwork sequence from the following: circular, midline or diagonal, fully covering the ice and must include a variety of steps and turns including 3-turns and mohawks executed by each partner. *Synchronized Twizzles*: One synchronized twizzle, minimum 1 revolution by both partners is required. Vocal music is permitted. Duration: 2:15 +/-10 seconds.

BASIC SKILLS INTERPRETIVE PROGRAM:

The Organizing Committee will pre-select and edit musical choices appropriate for these events. During warm-up skaters will hear selection of music twice. Following the warm-up all skaters except for the first skater will be escorted to a soundproof locker room or another area of the arena. The first skater will hear the music one more time and then perform a program to the music. As each skater performs the next skater in line will be allowed to hear the music for the third time before they perform to the music. The listening skater will not be allowed to view the performing skater. Levels should be broken by ability with ages divided appropriately. Skaters are judged on originality, pattern, technical (the ability to include jumps and spins) and music interpretation/expression. Spins and jumps performed must be appropriate to competition level. Music Duration Free Skate 1-6: 1:15. There is to be no instruction allowed during this event from coaches, parents, or fellow skaters. Staging area must be kept clear except for ice monitor and listening competitor.

BASIC SKILLS SHOWCASE EVENTS:

Showcase events are open to skaters in Basic, Free Skate, and Adult. Groups will be divided by number of entries and ages if possible. Skaters must enter at the same level as their free skate event or highest test level of skater's in the group ensemble or production number. If a free skate event is not being entered, skaters must enter at their current test level or one level higher. Vocal music is permitted. Skaters will be judged on musical interpretation and feeling, expression, and how the skating relates to the music. Show costumes are permitted, as long as they do not touch or drag on the ice. Only hand held props are allowed. Props must remain in the skater's hand(s) at all times. Deductions will be made for skaters including technical elements not permitted in the event description.

Drop-ins will be allowed if time is available. There will be no refunds for unused or “no-show” sessions.

Refunds will be issued in accordance with Rule 3230 - 3235 of the US Figure Skating Rulebook and only if the event is not held or if the competitor can demonstrate that failure to participate is because of a medical condition that a physician certifies will prevent the competitor from competing safely, or because of a death in the competitor’s immediate family. In any event with only one entry, the skater will be given the option of withdrawing from the event (with a refund) or skating an exhibition or critique if time permits (without a refund). All refunds, if applicable, will be mailed within 30 days after the completion of the competition.

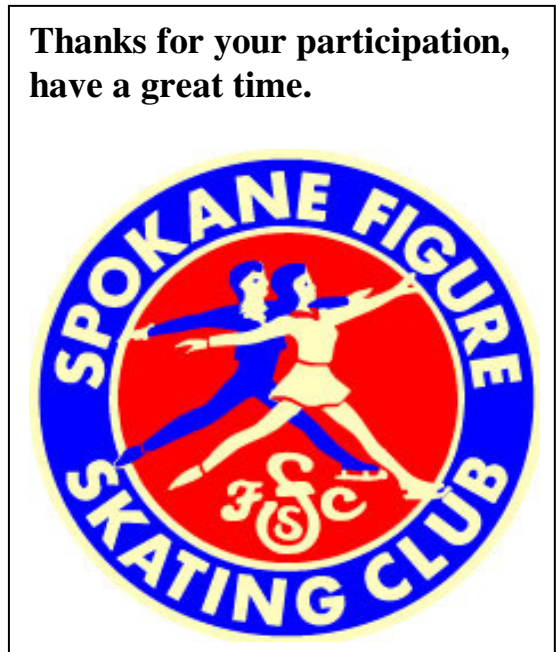
